The University has established a grievance redressal mechanism. A separate **Grievance Redressal Committee** is established under the leadership of the Vice Chancellor. The committee consists of senior members including senior women representatives.

This committee is responsible for tracking and monitoring of the grievances received or logged.

Being a completely residential system of education, a dedicated Warden is available as the authority along with some of the senior faculty members who reside in the student hostels. This group is in constant touch with the students to handle their concerns, if any.

The first batch of students was admitted only in academic year 2019-20. So far, no complaints have been reported/registered.

Admission Process

- The University constitutes an Admission Committee under the leadership of the Vice Chancellor to monitor the functioning of the admission process.
- The admission for each programme of the University is carried out in accordance with program regulation and criterion which will also determine the admission eligibility & selection procedure.
- The selection for all the UG and PG (commencing this year) courses in Arts and Science disciplines are based on academic record, performance in an entrance exam followed by a personal interview.
- Those who secure marks in the entrance exam above a cut-off fixed by the admission committee are interviewed, wherein the final selection is done based on candidate's overall standing on academic, extracurricular aspects as well as attitude and aptitude towards values-based education system.

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

The Trust is actively engaged in the quintessential expanses of societal relevance such as educare, healthcare, and sociocare; that caters exclusively to the education, health and nutrition needs of children, completely free-of-cost. In the last nine years, the Trust is operating 21 Campuses spread across 17 districts in Karnataka and one in Telangana in South India. Rural and urban poor are prioritised in the admission process and currently about 5000 students from the economically backward spectrum of the society are receiving the gift of integral values-based education in these temples of learning. Educare is the prime function of the Trust and it continues to spread wings to disseminate the power of transformative education to all the districts in Karnataka and across India, to prepare self-sacrificing individuals as leaders of tomorrow. Inauguration of five new Campuses specially for girls is temporarily stalled due to the COVID crisis.

PBMT in association with its allied Healthcare Trust, Sri Sathya Sai Health and Education Trust, contributes to the functioning of Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Hospitals dedicated to Child Heart Care. Paediatric Cardiac Surgery, Cath Interventions, Consultation, Screening, Research on Congenital Heart Diseases, and Training in Paediatric Cardiac Skills are some of the major functions of the Sanjeevani Hospitals, currently established in the three cities of Naya Raipur Atal Nagar (Chhattisgarh), Palwal (Haryana) and Kharghar (Navi Mumbai). PBMT has contributed towards 700 paediatric cardiac surgeries till date, which can be equated to 5.6% contribution out of the total 11,800 surgeries and cath interventions done by these hospitals.

On the wing of Sociocare, PBMT helps in the fulfilment of daily morning nutrition needs of children in collaboration with the Sri Sathya Sai Annapoorna Trust. Around 450,000 children studying in more than 6000 Government Schools across 17 States and three Union Territories are being provided with nutritious breakfast every morning, and till date 50 million breakfast meals have been served. PBMT supports nearly 7000 children every year for their nutrition needs, which when derived mathematically is about 10% of the total expenditure incurred by Annapoorna Trust, as they march towards the noble cause of ensuring that 'No child goes to school hungry ever'.

PBMT in partnership with Hewlett Packard (HP) has taken a step towards bridging the technology gap, by empowering children in Rural India with access to computer technology. As part of this effort, HP India has offered two 'HP World on Wheels' (WOW) mobile computer labs to Prashanthi Balamandira Trust as on date. With the successful collaboration between HP and PBMT that started in June 2018, the Trust is currently benefitting from the two mobile digital computer labs, which find its way to all the educational institutions operated by the Trust and provides digital literacy to all the students. These mobile labs have been equipped with self-contained, internetenabled and solar powered digital learning with a 20-seater space. From a futuristic angle, this initiative also aims at providing youth with digital literacy, e-Education, entrepreneurship training, vocational courses, video conferencing tutorials, and other citizen services in Rural India and thereby impacting more people across the country, in a beneficial way.

That the Trustees as executants of this Amendment Trust Deed confirm that all the provisions of the principal Trust deed executed on 02-04-1981 as set out in Clause 5 to Clause 43 and the additional clauses numbered as 44 to 50 appended by the amendment deed dated 28-05-2008 shall also continue to be in force. For ease of reference and convenience, all the clauses of the Principal Trust Deed dated 02-04-1981 and the Amendment Trust Deed dated 28-06-2008 as aforementioned, are reproduced, for ease of reference as sekput below:

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
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- All the decisions taken by the Trustees shall be placed at the lotus feet of 'BHAGAWAN SRI SATHYA SAI BABA'. Any guidance coming from Bhagawan shall be final, regarding all the matters of the Trust.
- The trustees can receive gifts/donations from others in cash or in kind and the gifts/donations
 so received together with the initial sum of Rs.1,001/- (Rupees One Thousand one only)
 settled under this deed shall form the corpus of the trust.
- The trust has been created for charitable purposes and the objects are:
 - To make donations to various funds or institutions or Government or Local authority recognised under Section 80-G(5) of the Income Tax Act, 1961.
 - 2) To serve the cause of welfare and all-round development of children.
 - a) By the establishment and running of schools, hostels and Balavikas Centres on the Principles of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Educational Philosophy.


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


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- b) Printing and publication of books, journals and disseminating knowledge with a view to inculcating of spirituality and building up of character.
- c) To hold lectures, seminars, study circles, periodical courses and conferences to enlighten people about child welfare.
- d) By the establishment and running of Hospitals, Clinics, rehabilitation centres Pathological and clinical laboratories.
- 3) To render service to the poor, destitute and sick children.
 - a) By the establishment of orphanages, destitute homes and the like.

- 9. On execution of this deed, the trustees shall take charge of the said sum of Rs.1,001/-(Rupees One thousand one only) and it will be the corpus or fixed property of the trust and it shall not be disposed of or subjected to any kind of charge for the purpose of meeting the expenses or for carrying out the objects of the trust or for any other purpose unless otherwise resolved unanimously by the Board of Trustees.
- 10. The trustees shall stand possessed of the said amount of corpus and such other properties (Both Moveable and Immoveable) as may be acquired from time to time by the Trust by purchase, exchange, grant subscription, endowment, donation, contribution or in any manner whatsoever (All of which shall be designated as 'Trust properties' on the Trust herein mentioned).
- 11 The trustees shall have power from time to time to increase or decrease the corpus of fixed property of the Trust and this corpus will not be used in contravention of Clause 9, hereinabove.

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
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
- 12. The trustees shall have power to accept donations either in cash or moveable properties either with or without any special conditions attached to it provided it does not contravene Clause 7 hereinabove.
- 13. It shall be competent for the trustees from time to time to frame, make and enforce all such rules, regulations and or bye-laws not inconsistent with the express provisions of this Trust as the trustees may deem proper for securing and facilitating the administration and management in detail of the various departments relating to the activities and affairs of the trust, and for convening, conducting and regulating the meetings of the trustees and for appointing sub-committees and administration of the trust estate and also from time to time repeal, after, amend, rescind or add to all such rules, regulations and bye-laws and also to pass resolutions in connection with all or any of the said matters at their meeting.
- 14. The trustees shall have power and authority to appoint or ongage and at their discretion change, remove, dismiss or suspend secretaries, treasurers, supervisors, cashiers, accounts clerks, chowkidars, attendants, servants and other officials or employees and persons in permanent, temporary or special service in connection with the work of the trust, trust estate, trust funds and trust properties as they may from time to time think fit and to determine their powers, and duties and fix their salaries bounds, emoluments and to require security in such instance or such instances and such amounts as the trustees may think fit. The trustees shall also have power to fund and maintain provident funds, gratuity funds, personal and other funds for any employees and make rules and regulations regarding the same.

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- 15. The trustees shall have power in general to acquire all things and do all acts necessary to carry out the objects of the trust.
- 16. The trustees shall be entitled to reimburse themselves out of the trust estate all expenses incurred in or about the execution of the trust or powers herein or in carrying out the trust its objects and affairs for the realization, preservation or benefit of the trust properties. The trustees shall be entitled to be indemnified by the trust properties against the consequence of all lawful acts done by the trustees in the course of and discharge of their duties as the trustees of these trusts and all costs charges and expenses thereof.
- 17. The trustees shall not be entitled to any remuneration and shall work in an honorary capacity, they shall, however be entitled to receive the out of pocket expenses incurred by them in the course of discharging the Trust.
- 18. The Trust shall be governed by a Board of Trustees; the Board of Trustees shall consist of all the trustees, the number of which shall always be not less than three and not more than nine.
- 19. The Trustees may elect or nominate one of them as the Managing Trustee who will also act as the Chairman of the Board of Trustees. The Managing Trustee may be appointed for any period of time. The first managing trustee will be Shri K.R. SASTRY for his life time. The first trustees shall be trustee for time.

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
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- 20. The first trustee shall be trustee for life. In case of death, inability, resignation or retirement, the remaining Board of Trustees shall be entitled to nominate any other person as may think fit and proper to act as the Trustee in place of the trustee so dying or being unable to act. Provided that the trustee so appointed will have the same powers and rights as if he was originally appointed the trustee under these presents.
- 21. The trustee may at any time invite and receive or without such invitation receive any voluntary contribution or contributions either from the settler or from the trustees or from anyone or more of them or from any other person or persons by way of donation, legally or otherwise. All such contribution shall be treated as forming part of the trust fund being the subject matter of those presents provided that it shall always be for the trustees in their absolute discretion to decide whether they should invite and or accept any such contribution and they shall at all times be at liberty to refuse any contribution without giving any reason for such refusal.
- Subjects to the provisions herein above the trustee shall not keep with them at any time more than Rs 5,000/- (Rupees Five Thousand Only) in cash.
- 23. The trustees shall have power to deposit the trust monies or any portion thereof in any nationalised Bank or Banks either by way of fixed deposits or in current account or Savings bank Account to be operated icintly by two trustees one of whom shall be the managing trustee and the other trustee is to be nominated by Board of Trustees.

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
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- 24. The trustees shall also have power to invest the trust money in any Government securities or in any other approved manner and also to invest in such manner as may be directed by the Board of Trustees, and from time to time vary the investment in which the trust fund may be invested.
- 25. The Income derived from the trust properties shall be applied by the trustees for any one or all of the objects of the trust. Any income of the trust arising from the corpus which has not been spent in any year shall be invested in accordance with Section 11 (2) of the Income Tax Act 1961.
- The trust money shall not be invested within a private Individual or firm or association of persons or body of Individuals.
- 27. For the purpose of carrying out of the objects for the trust, the trustees shall have power to acquire by purchase or on lease or otherwise any immoveable properties of any tenure and in case of vacantland, the trustees shall be at liberty to credt buildings thereon and to do all acts necessary and incidental thereto.
- 28. It shall be lawful for the trustees to pull down, renovate, rebuild, alter, adopt, improve and add to, develop or repair any immoveable property comprised in the trust properties and to extend thereon such manage out of the trust fund or the Income thereof as they may think fit.

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
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- 29. The Board of Trustees shall be entitled to enter into any agreements or covenants, with the owners or persons entitled to or interested in any other properties and to raise funds by way of loans.
- 30. It shall be lawful for the trustees at such time or times as may in their absolute discretion think fit, sell by public auction or private contract or exchange or transfer or assign or grant leases or subleases for any term however long or otherwise dispose off all or any part of the trust properties including Immoveable properties.

It shall be lawful and competent for the managing trustee in his discretion to make donations from the trust properties and or send the moneys of the trust in his discretion in any other manner to carry out the objects of the trust and not contravening clause 7 hereinabove. 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
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- 33. The entire control, regulation, management, application and administration of the trust properties whether capital or income, rent interest or profit of any kind shall be in the discretion of the trustees.

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
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


- 37. A minute book shall be kept by the trustees. That in the event of dissolution or winding up of the Trust, the assets remaining as on the date of dissolution shall under no circumstances be distributed among the trustees, but the same shall be transferred to another charitable trust/ society whose objects are similar to those of this trust/society and which enjoy recognition under section 80 G of the Income Tax Act 1961, as amended from time to time.)

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

SRI SATHYA SAI UNIVERSITY FOR HUMAN EXCELLENCE ACT, 2018

(Received the assent of the Governor on the nineteenth day of April, 2018)

An Act to establish and incorporate in the State of Karnataka a University of unitary nature in private sector by the Prashanthi Balamandira Trust®, North Extension, Chikkaballapura (Taluk & Dist) to promote and undertake the advancement of and innovation in University Education leading up to and including Degree, Post Graduate, Doctoral, Post Doctoral and other courses in Arts, Literature, Languages, Humanities, Commerce, Education, Philosophy, Science, Engineering and Technology, Management, Law, Music, Life, Yoga and Health Sciences, Physical and Allied Science Courses to make provisions for research, advancement and dissemination of knowledge, including consultancy and the matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Whereas it is expedient to establish and incorporate in the State of Karnataka an University of unitary nature in private sector by the Prashanthi Balamandira Trust®, North Extension, Chikkaballapura (Taluk & Dist) to promote and undertake the advancement of and innovation in University Education leading up to and including Degree, Post Graduate, Doctoral, Post Doctoral and other courses in Arts, Literature, Languages, Humanities, Commerce, Education, Philosophy, Science, Engineering and Technology, Management, Law, Music, Life, Yoga and Health Sciences, Physical and Allied Science Courses and to make provisions for research, advancement and

dissemination of knowledge, including consultancy and the matters connected therewith or incidental thereto for the purposes hereinafter appearing;

Be it enacted by the Karnataka State Legislature in the sixty ninth year of the Republic of India as follows:-

CHAPTER-I

PRELIMINARY

- Short Title, Extent and Commencement.— (1) This Act may be called Sri Sathya Sai University for Human Excellence Act, 2018.
 - (2) It extends to the whole of the State of Karnataka.
- (3) It shall come into force on such date as the State Government may, by notification, in the official Gazette, appoint.
 - 2. Definitions .- In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,-
 - (a) "Academic Council" means the Academic Council of the University as specified in section 26;
 - (b) "Agenda Matters" means all the matters and businesses to be designated in the Statutes each of which can be either included in the Agenda or be taken up for discussion and decision at a meeting of the Board of Governors or the Board of Management or Academic Council or other Authorities of the University or any Committees, as the case may be, only subject to the prior written approval of the Chancellor, consenting to the passing of such matters and businesses at such a meeting;
 - (c) "Board of Governors" means the Board of Governors of the University as specified in section 24;
 - (d) "Board of Management" means the Board of Management of the University as specified in section 25;
 - (e) "Chancellor", "Pro Chancellor", "Vice-Chancellor" means respectively the Chancellor, Pro Chancellor and Vice Chancellor of the University;
 - (f) "Campus" means campuses established and maintained by the University situated within the State;
 - (g) "Committees" means the committees formed under this Act or by the various functionaries of the University as the case may be and includes the Nomination Committee, the Finance Committee and such other committees;
 - (h) "Constituent College" means a Colleges or Centres or Institutions established and maintained by the University;
 - "Finance Committee" means the Finance Committee of the University as specified in Section 28;
 - (j) "Government" means the Government of Karnataka;
 - (k) "National Accreditation Bodies" means a body established by the Central Government for laying down norms and conditions for ensuring academic standards of higher education, such as University Grants Commission, All India Council for Technical Education, National Council for Teacher Education, Medical Council of India, Pharmacy Council of India, National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Indian Council of Agriculture Research, Council of Scientific and Industrial Research, Bar Council of India etc., and includes the Government;
 - (l) "Prescribed" means prescribed by rules made by the Government under this Act;

- (m) "Principal or Director in relation to a Constituent College or Centre" means the head of the Constituent College or Centre and includes, where there is no Principal or Director in the absence of a Principal or Director appointed, the Vice-Principal or Joint Director, any other person for the time being appointed to act as Principal or Director;
- (n) "Registrar" means the Registrar of the University;
- (o) "Regional Centre" means a centre established or maintained by the University for the purpose of coordinating and supervising the work of Study Centres in any region within the state and for performing such other functions as may be conferred on such centre by the Board of Management;
- (p) "Sponsoring Authority" or "Sponsoring Body" in relation to this Act means Sponsoring Trust;
- (q) "Trust" means the Prashanthi Balamandira Trust®, North Extension, Chikkaballapura (Taluk & Dist) Registered under the Registration Act, 1908;
- (r) "State" means State of Karnataka;
- "Statutes" and "Regulations" means respectively the Statutes and Regulations of the University made under this Act;
- (t) "Study Centre" means a centre within the state established and maintained by the University for the purpose of advising, counseling or for rendering any other assistance required by the students in the context of the education;
- (u) "Teacher" means and includes a Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor, Reader or Lecturer or such other person as may be appointed for imparting instruction or conducting or to guide research in the University or in a Constituent College and includes the Principal or Director of Constituent College in conformity with the norms specified by the University Grants Commission;
- "University" means Sri Sathya Sai University for Human Excellence established and incorporated under this Act;
- (w) "University Grants Commission" means the Commission established under Section 4 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (Central Act 3 of 1956);
- (x) "Visitor" means the visitor of the University as specified in Section-13.

CHAPTER-II

THE UNIVERSITY AND SPONSORING BODY

- 3. Proposal for the Establishment of the University. (1) Sponsoring Society shall have the right to establish the University of Unitary Nature subject to and in accordance with the provisions of this Act.
 - (2) The proposal to establish a University shall be made to the State Government by Society.
 - (3) The proposal shall contain the following particulars, namely:-
 - the objects of the University along with the details of Society;
 - (ii) the extent and status of the University and the availability of land;
 - (iii) the nature and type of programmes of study and research to be undertaken by the University during a period of five academic years immediately following the commencement date;
 - (iv) the nature of faculties, courses of study and research proposed to be started;
 - (v) the campus development such as buildings, equipment and structural amenities;

- (vi) the phased outlays of capital expenditure for a period of five academic years immediately following the commencement date;
- (vii) the item-wise recurring expenditure, sources of finance and estimated expenditure for each student;
- (viii) the scheme for mobilizing resources and the cost of capital thereto and the manner of repayments to each source;
- (ix) the scheme of generation of funds internally through the recovery of fee from students, revenues anticipated from consultancy and other activities relating to the objects of the University and other anticipated incomes;
- (x) the details of expenditure on unit cost, the extent of concessions or rebates in fee, freeship and scholarship for students belonging to economically weaker sections and the fee structure indicating varying rate of fee, if any, that would be levied on students who are either non resident Indians or persons of Indian origin or sponsored by non resident Indians or persons of Indian origin and students of nationalities other than India;
- (xi) the years of experience and expertise in the concerned discipline at the command of Sponsoring Society; as well as the financial resources;
- (xii) the system for selection of students to the courses of study at the University;
- (xiii) status of fulfillment of such other conditions as may be required by the State Government to be fulfilled before the establishment of the University.
- (4) A Screening Committee shall be constituted by the State Government consisting of three members who are Ex-officio members of Karnataka State Higher Education Council to examine the proposal received from the Sponsoring Society which has to make recommendations to the State Government for establishment of the University.
- 4. Establishment of the University.- (1) Where the State Government, after considering the recommendations of the screening Committee and holding such inquiry as it may deem necessary, is satisfied that,-
 - (i) the Society has ability to run a University with sufficient Infrastructure.
 - (ii) the Society owns a land to the extent specified below in accordance with its location namely:-
 - (a) twenty five acres of land if it is within limits of Bruhat Bangalore Mahanagara Palike;
 - (b) forty acres of land if it is outside the limits of Bruhat Bangalore Mahanagara Palike but within Bangalore Metropolitan Region Development Authority Area;
 - (c) Not less than fifty acres of land in the places other than the places specified in clauses (a) and (b).

The land specified above shall consist of a single block and it shall be in the name of the concerned Society or Trust or foundation or institution or university itself. Based on the furnished particulars required in sub-section (3) of section 3, the Government may direct the Trust to establish the permanent Statutory Endowment Fund as specified in section 48.

- (2) After the establishment of the Permanent Statutory Endowment Fund, the State Government may, by notification, in the official Gazette, accord sanction for establishment of the University of Unitary nature in the State by the name of "Sri Sathya Sai University for Human Excellence".
- (3) The headquarters of the University shall be at Navanihal Village, Kamalapura, Kalaburgi. The University shall have Campuses or Regional and Study Centre's anywhere in Karnataka after

five years of establishment of the University subject to the prior permission of the State Government and as per UGC norms.

- (4) The First Chancellor, the First Pro-Chancellor, the First Vice-Chancellor, First members of the Board of Governors, First members of the Board of Management and the Academic Council and all persons who may hereafter become such officers or members, so long as they continue to hold such office or membership, shall constitute a body corporate and can sue and be sued in the name of the-University.
- (5) On sanction for the establishment of the University under sub-section (2), the land and other movable and immovable properties acquired, created, arranged or built by Sponsoring Trust for the purpose of the University shall vest in the University.
- (6) In all suits and other legal proceedings by or against the University, the pleading shall be signed and verified by, and all processes in such suits and proceedings shall be issued to and be served on the Registrar (Administration).
- (7) The land, building and other properties of the University shall not be used for any purpose other than incidental to the objects of the University.
- 5. Grants and Financial Assistance.— The University shall be self-financing and non-profit making organisation shall neither make a demand nor shall be entitled to any maintenance grant-in-aid or any other financial assistance from the State or any other body or corporation owned or controlled by the State:

Provided that the State may, provide financial support through grants or otherwise,-

- (a) For research, development and other activities for which other State Government organizations are provided financial assistance; or
- (b) For any specific research or programmes receiving support from the State Government; or
- (c) For the benefit of the similar Universities in the State whether subject to a change in State Policy or otherwise;

Provided further that, the University may receive any financial support from any other source.

- 6. Power to Establish Constituent College or Centre, Additional Campuses, Regional Centres or Study Centres. The University may have Constituent Colleges, Regional Centres, additional campuses, Centres and Study Centres at such places in the State as it deems fit after the completion of five years after its establishment with prior approval of the State Government subject to norms of UGC and other National Accreditation bodies.
- 7. Objects of the University.- The University shall employ a broad range of strategies to achieve its vision and objectives,-
 - (i) to support, promote and undertake advancement of and innovation in University education leading up to and including Degree, Post Graduate, Doctoral, Post Doctoral courses in Arts, Literature, Languages, Humanities, Commerce, Education, Philosophy, Science, Engineering and Technology, Management, Law, Music, Life, Yoga and Health Sciences, Physical and Allied Science Courses to make provisions for research, advancement and dissemination of knowledge, including consultancy in these fields;
 - to collaborate with any other universities, research institutions, non-profit organizations, industry associations, professional associations or other organizations, to conceptualize, design, develop and offer specific educational and research programmes, training programmes and exchange programmes for students, faculty members and others;
 - (iii) to undertake collaborative research and advocacy with any organizations with prior approval of the State Government;

- (iv) to disseminate and advance knowledge by providing instructional and research facilities in such branches of learning as it may deem fit and in particular, to make special provisions for integrated courses in proposed area and other such Higher Educational Programmes of the University and to make appropriate measures for promoting interdisciplinary studies and research;
- (v) to provide innovative system of University level education, flexible and open with regard to methods and places of learning, combination of courses eligibility for enrolment, age of entry, conduct of examinations and operation of programmes with a view to promoting access and equity in higher learning besides encouraging excellence in new fields of knowledge and placing special emphasis on both academic as well as application oriented learning;
- (vi) to develop resource centers to contribute to quality education with prior approval of State Government;
- (vii) to establish Campuses, Regional Centers, Centers, Study Centers and Constituent Colleges at various locations in Karnataka after five years of establishment of the University and to contribute and develop an understanding of educational change in technical, professional, general education and social and human development with prior approval of Government;
- (viii) to institute degrees, diplomas, certificates and other academic distinctions like award of credits on the basis of successful completion of academic work evaluated through multiple modern methods of assessment;
- (ix) to disseminate knowledge and develop a public debate on issues of education and allied development fields through seminars, conferences, executive education programmes, community development programmes, publications and training programmes and events;
- (x) to undertake programmes for development and training of faculty and researchers of the University in partnership with any other university of quality with prior approval of the State Government;
- (xi) to undertake necessary or expedient action to pursue and promote the objectives of the University;
- (xii) to pursue any objectives as may be approved by the Government for the enhancement of education and other development sectors in India.

8. Powers of the University.- The University shall have the following powers, namely:-

- (i) to establish and maintain such Campuses, Regional Centres and Study Centres in Karnataka after five years from the date of establishment of the University as may be determined by the University from time to time in the manner laid down by the Statutes with prior approval of the Government and as per UGC norms.
- (ii) to carry out all such other activities as may be necessary or feasible in furtherance of the object of the University.
- (iii) to confer degrees or other academic distinctions in the manner and under conditions lay down in the Statutes.
- (iv) to institute and award fellowships, scholarships and prizes, awards, medals etc., in accordance with the Statutes.
- (v) to demand and receive such fees, bills, invoices and collect charges as may be fixed by the Statutes or rules, as the case may be.
- (vi) to make provisions for extracurricular activities for students and employees.
- (vii) to make appointments of the Faculty, officers and employees of the University or a Constituent College, Campuses, Regional Centers, Study Centers.

- (viii) to receive voluntary donations and gifts of any kind not prohibited by any Law for the time being in force and to acquire, hold, manage, maintain and dispose of any movable or immovable property, including Trust and endowment properties for the purpose of the University or a Constituent College or a Centre or a Campus and Regional Centre.
- (ix) to institute and maintain hostels and to recognize places of residence for students of the University or a Constituent College or a Centre.
- (x) to supervise and control the residence and to regulate the discipline among the students and all categories of employees and to lay down the conditions of service of such employees, including the Code of Conduct for the students and employees.
- (xi) to create academic, administrative and support staff and other necessary posts.
- (xii) to co-operate and collaborate with other Universities in such a manner and for such purposes as the University may determine from time to time.
- (xiii) to organize and conduct refresher courses, orientation courses workshops, seminars and other programmes for teachers, lesson writers, evaluators and other academic staff.
- (xiv) to determine standards of admission to the University or a Constituent College, Centers, Regional Centers, Study Centers with the approval of Academic Council and to make admission of students of Karnataka not less than the extent provided in this Act.
- (xv) to do all such other acts or things whether incidental to the powers aforesaid or not, as may be necessary to further the objects of the University.
- (xvi) to institute Degrees, Diplomas, Certificates and other academic distinctions on the basis of examination or any other method of evaluation approved by the Government.
- (xvii) to provide for the preparation of instructional materials, including films, cassettes, tapes, video cassettes, CD, VCD and other software and other relevant electronic and print media.
- (xviii) to raise, collect, subscribe and borrow money with the approval of the Board of Governors whether on the security of the property of the University, for the purposes of the University.
- (xix) to acquire, takeover, and run the management of any other educational institution with the prior approval of the State Government.
- (xx) to acquire properties with the prior approval of the Board of Management.
- (xxi) to undertake any other activities connected with or incidental to above objectives of the University.
- 9. University Open to All Classes, Castes, Creed, Gender or Nation. The University admissions shall be open to all persons irrespective of caste, class, creed, gender or nation. All admissions shall be made on the basis of merit in the qualifying examinations:

Provided that forty percent of the admissions in all courses of the university shall be reserved for the students of Karnataka State and admissions shall be made through a Common Entrance Examination conducted by the Central Government or State Government agency, as the case maybe and seats shall be allotted as per the merit and reservation policy of the State Government from time to time.

Provided further that, where there are less than ten seats in any course like Post Graduate, they shall be reserved by clubbing such courses together and where there are less than three seats in any course they shall be reserved by rotation.

- 10. National Accreditation. The University shall seek accreditation from respective Statutory National Accreditation Bodies soon after its establishment. Further all the courses run by this University shall be as per the regulations of the National Accreditation Bodies.
- 11. Powers of the Sponsoring Body.- The Sponsoring Body shall have the following powers with reference to the University, each of which may be exercised by the Sponsoring Body at its discretion, namely:-
 - to appoint or re-appoint or terminate the appointment of the Chancellor and Pro Chancellor;
 - (ii) to constitute the first Board of Governors of the University;
 - (iii) to nominate the Chairperson of the Board of Governors;
 - (iv) to nominate three persons as members of the Board of Governors;
 - (v) to nominate two persons as members of the Board of Management;
 - (vi) to determine the source of funds to be contributed to the University Endowment Fund;
 - (vii) to determine the application and spending of moneys by the University;
 - (viii) to resolve any conflict at the meeting of the Board of Governors in the manner provided for in this Act.

CHAPTER - III OFFICERS OF THE UNIVERSITY

- 12. Officers of the University.- The following shall be the officers of the University, namely:-
 - (i) The Visitor;
 - (ii) The Pro-Visitor;
 - (iii) The Chancellor;
 - (iv) The Pro-Chancellor;
 - (v) The Vice-Chancellor;
 - (vi) The Deans of Faculty;
 - (vii) The Registrar (Administration);
 - (viii) The Registrar (Evaluation);
 - (ix) The Finance Officer; and
 - (x) Such other officers as may be declared by the Statutes to be officers of the University.
- 13. The Visitor.- (1) His Excellency the Governor of Karnataka shall be the Visitor of the University and the visitor may offer suggestions for the improvement of the functioning of the University.
- (2) The Visitor shall preside at the convocation of the University for conferring degrees and diplomas.
 - (3) The Visitor shall have the following powers, namely:-
 - (i) to call for any paper or information relating to the affairs of the University;
 - (ii) on the basis of the information received by the Visitor and if he is satisfied that any order, proceedings or decision taken by any authority of the University is not in conformity with the Act, Regulations, or Rules, he may issue such directions as he may deem fit in the interest of the University and the directions so issued shall be complied with by all the concerned.

- 14. The Pro-Visitor.- (1) The Hon'ble Minister for Higher Education, Government of Karnataka shall be the Pro-Visitor of the University.
- (2) The Pro-Visitor shall, when the Visitor is absent, preside at the Convocation of the University for conferring degrees and diplomas.
 - 15. The Chancellor.- (1) The Chancellor shall be appointed by the Sponsoring Authority.
- (2) The founder trustee of the Sponsoring Body shall be the first Chancellor, who shall hold for life or till he demits office.
- (3) The subsequent Chancellor shall be either one of Trustee of the Sponsoring Body or such other person of eminence of national figure in the field of education, science, culture or public life, when such an appointment is being considered, as may be decided by the Sponsoring Body.
- (4) The subsequent Chancellor so appointed shall hold the office as determined by the Sponsoring Body.
- (5) The Chancellor shall have such powers as may be conferred on him by this Act or the Statutes made there under, which shall include the following powers, namely:-
 - (i) to function as the Head of the University;
 - to preside at all convocations of the University in absence of Visitor and Pro-Visitor;
 - (iii) to function as a Chairperson of the Board of Governors of the University;
 - (iv) to appoint or re-appoint or terminate the appointment of the Vice-Chancellor, in accordance with the provisions of this Act and the Statutes;
 - (v) to nominate a person as a member of the Nomination Committee as referred to in sub-section (2) of section 16 of this Act;
 - (vi) to pre-approve the appointment of the Vice Chancellor, the Registrar (Administration), the Registrar (Evaluation), the Finance Officer and the Deans;
 - (vii) to nominate two academicians as members on the Board of Governors;
 - (viii) to appoint the first Vice-Chancellor and the Finance Officer;
 - to constitute the first Board of Management, the Finance Committee, the Research Council and the Academic Council;
 - (x) to pre-approve the Agenda matters in the manner provided for in the Act;
 - (xi) to resolve a conflict (excluding conflicts at a meeting of the Board of Governors) in the manner provided in this Act.
- (6) In the event of there being a conflict inter-se between the functionary or body and any other functionary or body of the University, then the issue shall be referred to the Chancellor and the decision of the Chancellor in respect of such issue shall be final and binding on the University.
- 16. The Pro-Chancellor. (1) The Pro-chancellor shall be Appointed by the Sponsoring Body who is a person of eminence in the field of Education, Science, Culture or Public Life.
- (2) The Pro-Chancellor shall exercise all powers of the Chancellor in his absence or shall exercise the powers as entrusted by the Chancellor or perform such duties as may be laid down by the Statutes.
- (3) The Pro-chancellor shall chair all the Committees, meetings and convocations in the absence of the chancellor.
- (4) The services of the Pro-Chancellor may be terminated by the Chancellor at any point of time as he deems fit.
- 17. The Vice-Chancellor.- (1) The Vice-Chancellor shall be appointed by the Chancellor for a term of three years subject to other terms and conditions as may be laid down by the Statutes from among three persons recommended by the Nomination Committee constituted in accordance with the

provisions of sub-section (2). After the term of three years, it is renewable for another term of three years.

Provided that a Vice-chancellor shall continue to hold the office even after expiry of his term till new Vice-Chancellor joins. However, in any case this period shall not exceed one year.

- (2) The Nomination Committee referred to in sub-section (1) shall consist of the following persons, namely:-
 - (i) One person nominated by the Chancellor;
 - (ii) Two nominees of the Board of Governors, one of whom shall be nominated as the Convener of the Committee by the Board of Governors.
- (3) The Nomination Committee shall, on the basis of merit, recommend three persons suitable to hold the office of the Vice-Chancellor and forward the same to the Chancellor along with a concise statement showing the academic qualifications and other distinctions of each person.
- (4) The Vice-Chancellor shall be the Principal Executive and Academic Officer of the University and shall exercise general supervision and control over the affairs of the University and give effect to the decisions of the authorities of the University.

Provided that, where any matter, other than the appointment of a Teacher is of urgent nature requiring immediate action and the same could not be immediately dealt with by any officer or the authority or other body of the University empowered by or under this Act to deal with it, the Vice-Chancellor may take such action as he may deems fit with the prior written approval of the Chancellor.

(5) The Vice-Chancellor shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be laid down by the Statutes or the Rules.

Provided that, where in the opinion of the Vice-chancellor, any decision of any authority of the university is outside the powers conferred by this Act or Statutes, Regulations or Rules made there under or is likely to be prejudicial to the interests of the university, he shall request the concerned authority to revise its decision within fifteen days from the date of its decision and in case the authority refuses to revise such decision wholly or partly or fails to take any decision within fifteen days, then such matter shall be referred to the Chancellor and his decision thereon shall be final.

- (6) The services of the Vice-Chancellor can be terminated by the Chancellor with the approval of the Board of Governors after following the principles of natural justice and after providing an opportunity to present his case including for termination on disciplinary grounds.
- (7) The Vice-Chancellor shall preside at the convocation of the University in the absence of the Visitor, Pro-Visitor and the Chancellor.
- 18. Deans of Faculty.- Deans of faculty shall be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor with the written approval of the Chancellor in such manner and they shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be laid down by the Statutes.
- 19. The Registrar (Administration).- (1) The Registrar (Administration) shall be appointed by the Chancellor in such manner and on such terms and conditions as may be laid down by the Statutes.
- (2) All contracts as defined in statutes shall be entered into and signed by the Registrar on behalf of the University.
- (3) The Registrar shall have the power to authenticate records on behalf of the University and shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may conferred by the statutes or may be required from time to time, by the Chancellor or the Vice-Chancellor.
- (4) The Registrar shall be responsible for the due custody of the records and the common seal of the University and shall be bound to place before the Chancellor or the Vice-Chancellor or any other authority, all such information and documents as demanded.

- 20. The Registrar (Evaluation).- (1) The Registrar (Evaluation) shall be appointed by the Chancellor in such manner and on such terms and conditions as may be laid down by the Statutes.
- (2) The Registrar (Evaluation) shall be responsible for conduct of examinations of the University from time to time as defined in Statutes.
- (3) The Registrar (Evaluation) shall have the power to authenticate Examination related records on behalf of the University and shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may conferred by the statutes or may be required from time to time, by the Chancellor or the Pro Chancellor or the Vice-Chancellor.
- (4) The Registrar (Evaluation) shall be responsible for the due custody of the Examination related records, degrees, certificates and the common seal of the University and shall be bound to place before the Chancellor or the Vice-Chancellor or any other authority, all such information and documents as demanded.
- 21. The Finance Officer.- The Finance Officer shall be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor with the written approval of the Chancellor in such manner and he shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be laid down by the Statutes.
- 22. Other Officers.- The manner of appointment, terms and conditions of service and powers and duties of the other officers of the University shall be such as may be specified by Statutes.

CHAPTER - IV AUTHORITIES OF THE UNIVERSITY

- 23. Authorities of the University.- The following shall be the authorities of the University, namely:-
 - (i) The Board of Governors;
 - (ii) The Board of Management;
 - (iii) The Academic Council;
 - (iv) The Research and Innovation Council;
 - (v) The Finance Committee; and
 - (vi) Such other authorities as may be declared by the Statutes to be the authorities of the University.
- 24. The Board of Governors and its Powers.- (1) The Board of Governors shall consist of the following, namely:-
 - (i) The Chancellor Chairperson
 - (ii) The Pro-Chancellor Member
 - (iii) The Vice-Chancellor Member
 - (iv) The Registrar (Administration)
 - (v) The Registrar (Evaluation)
 - (vi) The Principal Secretary /Secretary to the State Government in the Department of Higher Education or by his nominee not below the rank of Deputy Secretary
 - (vii) The Principal Secretary/Secretary to the State Government in the Department of Medical Education or his nominee not below the rank of Deputy Secretary
 - (viii) One expert from the field of Management or Education or Finance or any other specialized sector to be nominated by the State Government.
 - (ix) Three persons nominated by the Sponsoring Body of whom one shall be a woman;
 - (x) One eminent educationist nominated by the University Grants Commission

- (2) The Registrar (Administration) shall be the Member Secretary of the Board of Governors.
- (3) The tenure of office of the members of the Board of Governors, appointment of members, other than Government nominees, renewal and removal, etc., shall be such as may be laid down by the Statutes.
- (4) All meetings of the Board of Governors shall always be chaired by the Chancellor or Pro-Chancellor and in their absence by any one of the nominees of the Chancellor. If Chancellor has not nominated any person to Chair such a meeting, members present in the meeting shall elect the Chairperson for that meeting only from among themselves by a simple majority.
- (5) Quorum for all meetings of the Board of Governors shall be three members attending and voting at such meeting.

Provided that the presence of either the Chancellor or Pro chancellor or one nominee of the Sponsoring Body and in the absence of the Chancellor or one nominee of Sponsoring Body, the Vice Chancellor, shall always be necessary to form the quorum for any meeting of the Board of Governors.

- (6) The Board of Governors shall be the Principal Governing Body of the University and shall have the following powers, namely:-
 - to appoint the Statutory Auditors of the University;
 - (ii) to lay down policies to be pursued by the University;
 - (iii) to review decisions of the other authorities of the University if they are not in conformity with the provisions of this Act, or the Statutes or the Rules;
 - (iv) to approve the Budget and Annual Report of the University;
 - (v) to make new or additional Statutes or amend or repeal the earlier Statutes and Rules;
 - (vi) to take decision about voluntary winding up of the University;
 - (vii) to approve proposals for submission to the Government;
 - (viii) to nominate three members to the Fee Regulation Committee;
 - (ix) to take such decisions and steps as are found desirable for effectively carrying out the objects of the University.
 - (7) The Board of Governor shall, meet at least three times a year.
- (8) The Board of Governors shall meet at such time and place as may be specified by Statute.
- 25. The Board of Management. The Board of Management shall consist of the following, namely:-
 - (i) The Vice Chancellor;
 - (ii) The Registrar (Administration);
 - (iii) The Registrar (Evaluation);
 - (iv) The Finance Officer;
 - (v) Two nominees of the Sponsoring Body;
 - (vi) Two Deans of the faculties as nominated by the Vice Chancellor.
- (2) The Vice Chancellor shall be the Chairperson of the Board of Management and the Registrar (Administration) shall be the Secretary of the Board of Management.
- (3) The Board of management shall be the executive body of the University. The powers and functions of the Board of Management shall be such as may be specified by the statutes.
- (4) All meetings of the Boards of Management shall always be chaired by the Vice Chancellor and in the absence of the Vice Chancellor, by the nominee of the Sponsoring Body and where the

Sponsoring Body has not nominated any nominees, then by any other member as elected by the members present in the meeting.

- (5) In the event of a conflict of opinion at a meeting of the Board of Management, the issue shall be referred to the Chancellor and the decision of the Chancellor in respect of such issue shall be final and binding on the University.
 - 26. The Academic Council.- (1) The Academic Council shall consist of the following, namely:-
 - (i) The Vice-Chancellor Chairperson
 - (ii) The Registrar (Administration) Member
 - (iii) The Registrar (Evaluation) Secretary
 - (iv) The Deans of all the Faculties Members
 - (v) Such other members as may be specified by the Statutes.
- (2) The Academic Council shall be the principal academic body of the University and shall, subject to the provisions of this Act, the Statutes, Regulations and the Rules, co-ordinate and exercise general supervision over the academic policies of the University.
- 27. The Research and Innovation Council.- (1) Research and Innovation Council shall be the Principal Research and Innovation Committee of the University and shall provide the larger holistic vision of the kind of research to be undertaken by the University, including prioritization of the research areas. Research and Innovation Council shall, subject to the provisions of this Act, the Statutes, Regulations and the Rules, co-ordinate and exercise general supervision over the Innovation and Research policies of the University.
 - (2) The Research and Innovation Council shall consist of the following, namely:-
 - (i) The Vice-Chancellor Chairperson
 - (ii) The Registrar (Administration) Member
 - (iii) The Registrar (Evaluation) Member
 - (iv) The Dean of Research & Innovation Secretary
 - (v) The HODs of Research & Innovation Members
 - (vi) Deans of all Faculties Members; and
 - (vii) Such other members as may be specified in the Statutes.
- 28. The Finance Committee.- (1) The Finance Committee shall consist of the following, namely:-
 - (i) The Chancellor or his nominee Chairperson
 - (ii) The Vice Chancellor Member
 - (iii) The Registrar (Administration) Member
 - (iv) The Registrar (Evaluation) Member
 - (v) The Finance Officer Secretary
 - (vi) One nominee of the Sponsoring Body Member; and
 - (vii) Such other members as may be specified in the statutes
- (2) The Finance Committee shall be the principal financial body of the University to take care of financial matters and shall, subject to the provisions of this Act, Rules and Statutes co-ordinate and exercise general supervision over the financial matters of the University.
- 29. Other Authorities.- The constitution, powers and functions of the other authorities of the University shall be such as may be specified by the statutes.
- 30. Disqualification for Membership of an Authority or a Body.- A person shall be disqualified for being a member of any of the authorities of bodies of the University, if he / she;

- (a) is of unsound mind and stands so declared by a competent court;
- (b) is an un-discharged insolvent;
- (c) has been convicted of any offence involving moral turpitude;
- (d) is conducting or engaging himself in private coaching classes; or
- (e) has been punished for indulging in or promoting unfair practice in the conduct of any examination, in any form, anywhere.
- (f) As and when the Sponsoring Body was to form an opinion in writing that a Member of any of the authorities or bodies is unfit to hold the post.
- 31. Proceedings not invalidated on Account of Vacancy. No act or proceedings of any authority of the University shall be invalid merely by reason of the existence of any vacancy or defect in the constitution of the authority.
- 32. Provisions pertaining to Agenda Matters.- (1) No Agenda Matter shall be either included in the Agenda for or taken up for discussion and decided in, the meeting of the Board of Governors or the Board of Management or any Committees without obtaining the prior written approval of the Chancellor.
- (2) In the event of breach, the Chancellor shall be entitled at all time to immediately take remedial action by reversing all decisions taken by any functionary or body of the University in breach of the provisions of the Act and consequent upon the pursuit of such a remedial action all such actions taken by the functionary or body of the University in breach of the provisions of the Act shall be deemed to be null and void, ab initio and consequently the status quo ante shall prevail in respect of the matter or decision in breach.

CHAPTER-V

STATUTES AND REGULATIONS

- 33. Statutes.- Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Statutes may provide for any matter relating to the University and staff, as given below, namely:-
 - the procedure for transaction of business of the Authorities of the University and the composition of bodies not specified in this Act;
 - (ii) subject to section 52 the operation of the permanent statutory endowment fund, University endowment fund, the general fund and the development fund;
 - (iii) the terms and conditions of appointment of the Vice-Chancellor, the Registrar and the Finance Officer and their powers and functions;
 - (iv) the mode of recruitment and the terms and conditions of service of the other officers, Teachers and employees of the University;
 - (v) the procedure for resolving disputes between the University and its officers, Faculty members, employees and students;
 - (vi) creation, abolition or restructuring of departments and faculties;
 - (vii) the manner of co-operation with other Universities or Institutions of Higher Learning;
 - (viii) the procedure for conferment of Honorary Degrees;
 - (ix) provisions regarding grant of free ships and scholarships;
 - (x) policies in respect of seats in different courses of studies and the procedure of admission of students to such courses;
 - (xi) policy relating to the fee chargeable from students for various courses of studies;
 - (xii) institution of fellowships, scholarships, studentships, free ships, medals and prizes;
 - (xiii) ny other matters which may be decided by the Board of Governors or required to be provided by statutes under this Act.
- 34. Statutes How Made.- (1) The first statutes framed by the Board of Management shall be submitted to the Board of Governors for its approval.

- (2) The Board of Governors shall consider the First Statutes, submitted by the Board of Management and shall give its approval thereon with such modifications, if any, as it may deem necessary.
- (3) The University shall publish the First Statutes, as approved by the Board of Governors in the University Notification, and thereafter, the First Statutes shall come into force from the date of its publication.
- 35. Power to amend the Statutes.- The Board of Governors may, make new or additional Statutes or amend or repeal the Statutes.
- **36. Regulations.-** Subject to the provisions of this Act, the regulations may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:-
 - admission of students to the University and their enrolment and continuance as such;
 - the courses of study to be laid down for all degrees and other academic distinctions of the University;
 - (iii) the award of degrees and other academic distinctions;
 - (iv) the conditions of the award of fellowships, scholarships, studentships, medals and prizes;
 - (v) the conduct of examinations and the conditions and mode of appointment and duties of examining bodies, examiners invigilators, tabulators and moderators;
 - (vi) the fee to be charged for admission to the examinations, degrees and other academic distinctions of the University;
 - (vii) the conditions of residence of the students at the University or a Constituent College;
 - (viii) maintenance of discipline among the students of the University or a Constituent College;
 - (ix) all other matters as may be provided in the Statutes under the Act.
- 37. Regulations how made.- The Regulations shall be made by the Academic Council and approved by Board of Management.
- 38. Power to amend regulations. The Academic Council may, with the approval of the Board of Management, make new or additional regulations or amend or repeal the regulations.
- 39. Fixation of fee.- (1) The fee in respect of forty percent of the admissions in all courses of the university for which admissions are made through a Common Entrance Examination conducted by the State Government or its agency under the proviso to section 9 shall be the fees, as fixed by the State Government, for Government seats from time to time, in accordance with the consensual agreement entered into by the Government and the University in accordance with the Karnataka Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Determination of Fee) Act, 2006 (Karnataka Act 8 of 2006).
- (2) In respect of other seats of the University, the fee shall be determined by the Fee Regulatory Committee constituted under the chairmanship of a retired Judge of the High Court in accordance with the provisions of section 6 of the Karnataka Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Determination of Fee) Act, 2006 (Karnataka Act 8 of 2006). For the purpose of this section, the University shall be deemed to be the Private Unaided Professional Educational Institution.

CHAPTER - VI

MISCELLANEOUS

- 40. Conditions of Service of Employees.- (1) Every employee shall be appointed under a written contract subject to such terms and conditions as may be specified by statutes and regulations or prescribed if any by rules which shall be kept in the University and a copy of which shall be furnished to the employee concerned.
- (2) Disciplinary action against the employees shall be governed by the procedure specified in the Statutes.

- (3) Any dispute arising out of the contract between the University and an employee shall, be resolved in the manner provided for in the written contract and in accordance with the Statues.
- 41. Right to Appeal.- In case of disciplinary actions by the University against its employee or student, the aggrieved employee or students shall have a right to appeal as specified by the statutes.
- **42. Provident or Pension Fund.-** The University shall constitute for the benefit of its employees such provident or pension fund and provide such insurance scheme as it may deem fit in such manner and subject to such conditions as may be specified by the statutes and the laws in force.
- 43. Disputes as to Constitution of University Authorities and Bodies.- If any question arises as to whether any person has been duly elected or appointed as, or is entitled to be a member of any authority or other body of the University, the matter shall be referred to the Chancellor whose decision thereon shall be final.
- 44. Constitution of Committees.- Any authority of the University mentioned in section 22, shall be empowered to constitute a committee of such authority, consisting of such members of such authority and having such powers as the authority may deem fit.
- 45. Filling of casual vacancies.- Any casual vacancy among the members, other than exofficio members of any Authority or body of the University shall be filled in the same manner in which the member whose vacancy is to be filled up, was chosen, and the person filling the vacancy shall be a member of such authority or body for the residual term for which the person in whose place he would have been a member.
- 46. Protection of action taken in good Faith.— No suit or other legal proceedings shall lie against any officer or other employee of the University for anything, which is done in good faith or intended to be done in pursuance of the provisions of this Act, the Statues or the Rules.
- **47. Transitional Provisions.** Notwithstanding anything contained in any other provisions of this Act and the Statues,-
 - (i) the first Vice-chancellor if any shall be appointed by the Chancellor;
 - (ii) the first Registrar (Administration), the first Registrar (Evaluation) and the first Finance Officer shall be appointed by the Chancellor; and
 - (iii) the first Board of Management, the first Finance Committee, the first Planning Board, the first Innovation and Research Council and the first Academic Council shall be constituted by the Chancellor.
- 48. Permanent Statutory Endowment Funds.- (1) The University shall establish a Permanent Statutory Endowment Fund of at least Rupees Twenty Five Crores out of which at least Fifteen Crores shall be in cash and remaining in the form of Bank guarantee which may be increased suo-moto but shall not be decreased.

Provided that in case of a University outside Bangalore or Bangalore Rural District at least Ten Crores must be in form of cash and the remaining Five Crores shall be in form of Bank Guarantee.

- (2) The University shall have power to invest the permanent Statutory Endowment Fund in such manner as may be prescribed by the statutes.
- (3) The University may transfer any amount from the General Fund or the Development Fund to the permanent Statutory Endowment Fund. Excepting in the event of dissolution of the University, in no other circumstances can any monies be transferred from permanent Statutory Endowment Fund for other purposes.
- (4) Seventy five percent of the incomes received from permanent Statutory Endowment Fund shall be used for the purpose of development or general work of the University. The remaining twenty five percent shall be reinvested in the permanent Statutory Endowment Fund.
- **49. University Endowment Fund.-** (1) The University shall establish a University Endowment Fund having such funds as may be determined by the Sponsoring Body which can include donations and other funds received from time to time.
- (2) The University shall have the power to invest the University Endowment Fund in a manner as may be specified by the Statutes.

- (3) The University Endowment Fund is a self-imposed fund that the University desires to maintain voluntarily and invest it responsibly to protect itself from financial challenges that may arise on account of pursuing social objectives and/or unforeseen circumstance.
- (4) The University may transfer any amount from the General Fund or the development fund to the University Endowment Fund. Excepting in the event of dissolution of the University, in no other circumstances can any monies be transferred from the University Endowment Fund for other purposes.
- (5) Eighty percent of the incomes received from the University Endowment Fund shall be used for the purposes of development or general work of the University. The remaining twenty percent shall be reinvested into the University Endowment Fund.
- **50. General Fund.-** (1) The University shall establish a General Fund to which the following amount shall be credited, namely:-
 - all fees which may be charged by the University;
 - (ii) all sums received from any other source not prohibited by any law for the time being in force;
 - (iii) all contributions made by the University;
 - (iv) all contributions/donations made in this behalf by any other person or body which are not prohibited by any law for the time being in force.
- (2) The funds credited to the General Fund shall be applied to meet all the recurring expenditure of the University.
- 51. Development Fund.- (1) The University shall establish a Development Fund to which the following funds shall be credited, namely:-
 - development fees which may be charged from students;
 - (ii) all sums received from any other source for the purposes of the development of the University;
 - (iii) all contributions made to the University;
 - (iv) all contributions/donations made in this behalf by any other person or body which are not prohibited by any law for the time being in force; and
 - (v) all incomes received from the Permanent Statutory Endowment Fund.
- (2) The funds credited to the Development Fund from time to time shall be utilized for the development of the University.
- **52.** Maintenance of Funds.- The funds established under sections 48, 49, 50 and 51 shall, subject to general supervision and control of the Board of Governors, be regulated and maintained in such manner as may be prescribed.
- 53. Annual Report.- (1) The annual report of the University shall be prepared under the direction of the Board of Management and shall be submitted to the Board of Governors for its approval.
- (2) The Board of Governors shall consider the annual report in its meeting and may approve the same with or without modification.
- (3) A copy of the annual report duly approved by the Board of Governors shall be sent to the Visitor and the State Government before 31st December following close of the financial year in 31st March of each year.
- 54. Accounts and Audit.- (1) The annual accounts and balance sheet of the University shall be prepared under the direction of the Board of Management and all funds accruing to or received by the University from all source and all amount disbursed or paid shall be entered in the account maintained by the University.
- (2) The annual accounts of the University shall be audited by an auditor, who is a member of the Institute of Charted Accountants of India, every year.
- (3) A copy of the annual accounts and the balance sheet together with the audit report shall be submitted to the Board of Governors before 30th November following close of the financial year in 31 March of each year.

- (4) The annual accounts, the balance sheet and the audit report shall be considered by the Board of Governors at its meeting and the Board of Governors, shall forward the same to the visitor and the Government along with its observation there on or before 31st December of each year.
- (5) In the event of any material alteration in the Report of the Auditors, the State Government may issue directions to the University, to rectify the alterations and such directions shall be binding on the University.
- 55. Mode of Proof of University Record.- A copy of any receipt, application, notice, order, proceeding or resolution of any authority or committee of the University or other documents in possession of the University or any entry in any register duly maintained by the University, if certified by the Registrar, shall be received as prima facie evidence of such receipt, application, notice, order, proceeding, resolution or document or the existence of entry in the register and shall be admitted as evidence of the matters and transaction therein recorded where the original thereof would, if produced, have been admissible in evidence.
- 56. Power of State Government to Issue Directions.- The State Government may give such directions to the University as in its opinion are necessary or expedient for carrying out the purposes of this Act or to give effect to any of the provisions contained therein or of any rules or orders made there under and the Board of Governor or the Board of management, as the case may be, of the University shall comply with every such direction.
- 57. Penalties.-(1) Whoever contravenes the provisions of this Act or the rules made there under or any examination matters or in matters relating to award of degrees or in giving marks cards shall on conviction be punishable with fine of rupees fifty thousand which may extend to ten lakhs rupees or with an imprisonment for a term of six months which may extend to two years or with both.

Provided that, where the University is also involved in committing the offence, the permission letter granted under this Act to commence the University shall be withdrawn.

- (2) A penalty under this section may be imposed without prejudice to the penalty specified in any other Act.
- 58. Power to Enter and Inspect.- Any officer not below the rank of Group 'A' officer authorized by the State Government in this behalf, shall, subject to such conditions as may be specified therein under the Karnataka Educational Institutions (Prohibition of Capitation Fee) Act, 1984 (Karnataka Act 37 of 1984) shall be deemed to be the officer authorized to exercise the same powers and discharge the same functions as provided under section 9 of that Act for the purposes of this Act.
- 59. Power to Give Direction for Dissolution of the University.- (1) If the University proposes dissolution in accordance with the law governing its constitution or incorporation, it shall give at least six months prior notice in writing to the Government.
- (2) The Karnataka State Higher Education Council shall conduct Inspection of University once in two years regarding;-
 - Standard of Instructions for grant of degree;
 - (ii) Quality of Education;
 - (iii) Avoidance of commercialization of Higher Education;
 - (iv) contravention of the provisions of the Act if any;
 - and send report to the Government.
- (3) On identification of mismanagement, maladministration and indiscipline, the Government shall issue directions to the management of the University to set right the administration. If the direction is not followed within such time as may be prescribed, the right to take decision for winding up of the University or any course thereof shall vest with the Government.
- (4) The manner of winding up of the University or any course thereof shall be such as may be prescribed by the Government in this behalf.

Provided that no such action shall be initiated without affording a reasonable opportunity to show cause to the University

- (5) On receipt of the notice referred to in sub-section (1), the Government shall, in consultation with the relevant Regulatory Authority make such arrangements for the administration of the University for the rest of the period of from the proposed date of dissolution of the University or winding up of the course and until the last batch of students in regular courses of studies of the University complete their courses of studies in such manner as may be specified by the Statues.
- **60. Expenditure of the University during Dissolution.-** (1) The expenditure of administration of the University during taking over period of its management under subsection (5) of section 58 shall be met out of the Permanent Statutory Endowment Fund, the General Fund or the Development Fund in such manner as may be prescribed.
- (2) If the fund referred to in section 48, 49, 50 and 51 are not sufficient to meet the expenditure of the University during the taking over period of its management, such expenditure may be met by disposing of the properties or asset of the University, by the Government.
- (3) Where the dissolution of the University is due to mismanagement or maladministration, the Government is at liberty to identify the persons responsible for such mismanagement or maladministration and to impose penalty as it deems fit.
- 61. Removal of Difficulties.- (1) If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Act, the State Government may, by a notification or by order, make such provisions, which are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, as appear to it to be necessary or expedient, for removing the difficulty:

Provided that, no notification or order under this section shall be made after the expiry of a period of five years from the date of commencement of this Act.

- (2) Every Order made under sub-section (1), shall, as soon as may be after it is made, be laid before the State Legislature.
- 62. Power to make rules by the State Government.- (1) The State Government may make rules, by notification, to carry out the purposes of this Act.
- (2) Every rule made under this Act shall be laid as soon as may be after it is made before each House of the State Legislature while it is in session for a total period of thirty days which may be comprised in one session or in two or more successive sessions, and if, before the expiry of the session immediately following the session or the successive sessions aforesaid, both Houses agree in making any modification in the rule or both Houses agree that the rule should not be made, the rule shall thereafter have effect only in such modified form or be of no effect, as the case may be, so however, that any such modification or annulment shall be without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done under that rule.

Based on the report of the Committee, Government has prepared draft SRI SATHYA SAI UNIVERSITY FOR HUMAN EXCELLENCE Bill and placed it before the Karnataka Legislature for its approval. After obtaining the approval of the Legislature and assent of Hon'ble Governor of Karnataka, SRI SATHYA SAI UNIVERSITY FOR HUMAN EXCELLENCE ACT, 2018 was published in the Official Gazette dated: 21-04-2018 and it was given effect from 8th March 2019 as published in the Official Gazette.

Whereas, as per Section 3 of SRI SATHYA SAI UNIVERSITY FOR HUMAN EXCELLENCE ACT, 2018, the PRASHANTHI BALAMANDIRA TRUST(R), CHIKKABALLAPURA, has submitted the proposal to Government for establishment of the SRI SATHYA SAI UNIVERSITY FOR HUMAN EXCELLENCE. Accordingly, Government of Karnataka has constituted a Committee vide its order No. ED 253 URC 2018, dated: 11-07-2018 to inspect the physical infrastructure available with PRASHANTHI BALAMANDIRA TRUST(R), CHIKKABALLAPURA, and to submit its report in terms of Section 3(3) of the said Act.

Whereas, the Committee constituted for the purpose, visited the PRASHANTHI BALAMANDIRA TRUST(R), NAVANIHALA VILLAGE, KAMALAPURA, KALABURAGI and also the land earmarked to establish its University campus at NAVANIHALA VILLAGE, KAMALAPURA, KALABURAGI, on 11-01-2019 and after due inspection submitted its report to Government on the issues as contained in Clauses (i) to (xiii) of Section 3(3) the SRI SATHYA SAI UNIVERSITY FOR HUMAN EXCELLENCE ACT, 2018.

Whereas, the PRASHANTHI BALAMANDIRA TRUST(R), CHIKKABALLAPURA, has created Statutory Fund of Rs.15.00 crores (Rupees Fifteen Crores only) as stipulated under Section 4 read with proviso to Section 48 of the SRI SATHYA SAI UNIVERSITY FOR HUMAN EXCELLENCE ACT, 2018.

Now, therefore, after considering all the facts, Government of Karnataka has accorded approval with the following terms and conditions to PRASHANTHI

BALAMANDIRA TRUST(R), CHIKKABALLAPURA, in accordance with Section 4(2) of SRI SATHYA SAI UNIVERSITY FOR HUMAN EXCELLENCE ACT, 2018 to establish and commence a Private University in the name and style "SRI SATHYA SAI UNIVERSITY FOR HUMAN EXCELLENCE" at NAVANIHALA VILLAGE, KAMALAPURA, KALABURAGI,

- The PRASHANTHI BALAMANDIRA TRUST(R), CHIKKABALLAPURA, shall have the right to establish the University of Unitary Nature subject to and in accordance with the provisions of this Act.
- 2. Since the University is being located at NAVANIHALA VILLAGE, KAMALAPURA, KALABURAGI,. The University shall establish a permanent Statutory Endowment Fund of Rs.15.00 Crores, out of which Rs.10.00 Crores shall be deposited in cash which shall be operated by the University with the joint signature of the Additional Chief Secretary/Principal Secretary to Government and remaining amount of Rs.5.00 Crores shall be in the form of Bank Guarantee.
- 3. The nature and functions of the University shall be strictly as per the provisions of SRI SATHYA SAI UNIVERSITY FOR HUMAN EXCELLENCE ACT, 2018. It shall also comply the rules that will be made under the Act in due course. The University shall also comply all the prevailing relevant laws, which concern the governance of the University in any aspect.
- Agenda matters shall be dealt as per section 2(b) of the Act.
- 5. "Statutes" and "Regulations" of the University under the Act shall be made within a period of 3 months from the date of this Notification.
- 6. The University is permitted to start the following courses in the campus, only after ensuring that necessary faculty is recruited and requisite infrastructure such as lab etc. is provided as per UGC Guidelines:-

- 7. As per section 4(3) and 6 of the Act, the University is not allowed to affiliate any other existing colleges of its own management till completion of five years and those colleges shall continue to be affiliated to the existing respective regular Universities. The constituent colleges, additional campuses, Regional Centres or Study Centres can only be established after five years from the date of commencement of the University with the prior permission of the state Government and shall be as per the norms of UGC and other National Accreditation bodies.
- 8. As per section 4(7) of the Act the property of the University shall be used for the purpose and objects of the University only.
- 9. The Trust shall possess land to an extent at least 50 acres.

- 10. The University shall always strive to achieve Global Standards and shall promote research and all progressive academic activities vigorously as per Section 7 of the Act.
- 11. The fees and other charges that may be collected by the University shall be as per the Statutes and rules as per section 8(v). Further provisions of section 39 of the Act regarding the Fee Regulation Committee shall be complied with.
- 12. The reservations in admissions shall be as per section 9 of the Act.
- 13. National Accreditations shall be sought from respective statutory bodies as per section 10 of the Act.
- 14. The directions of the Visitor to the University i.e. the Hon'ble Governor of Karnataka shall be complied by the University as and when they are issued.
- 15. All the statutory bodies and statutory functions are to be complied by the University well in time as per Act.
- 16. The periodical statutory reports shall be submitted to Government as per provisions of the Act.
- 17. The University shall prepare annual accounts as per section 54 of the Act and also the audit of the University shall be taken up as per sub section 2 of 54 of the Act.
- 18. The University shall place the annual accounts and audit reports before the Board of Governors before 30th November every year.
- 19. The Board of Governors shall send the annual accounts along with the annual reports and audit reports before 31st December every year to the Government.

SRI SATHYA SAI UNIVERSITY FOR HUMAN EXCELLENCE A NOTE ON EXAMINATION SYSTEM FOR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES

1. COURSES OF STUDY

Courses of study in each of the Undergraduate Programmes (B.Sc and B.A.) under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) shall comprise of the following categories:

1.1. <u>Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Courses</u>

A course pertaining to a discipline which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Discipline Specific Core course. Each undergraduate programme is a combination of three disciplines. In each of the disciplines there shall be a core course for the first four semesters. Hence there shall be TWELVE Discipline Specific Core course for each of the undergraduate programmes.

1.2. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Courses

A course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline of study or which provides an extended scope is Discipline Specific Elective course. In each of the disciplines there shall be an elective course for the semesters V and VI. Hence there shall be SIX Discipline Specific Elective for each of the undergraduate programmes.

1.3. Ability Enhancement Core (AEC) Course

This is a core course based upon the content that leads to communication, capability and knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all the disciplines. The following two AEC courses will run through all the semesters of the every UG programme in six parts:

<u>AEC 1</u>: Modern Indian Language MIL (Kannada, Sanskrit, Hindi, etc.). A student would opt for any one MIL and would continue to pursue learning in that language for all six semesters. The purpose of this course is to inculcate spoken and written communication ability in a particular language.

AEC 2: Self-Development and Communication Course (SDC):

The Self Development component aims to invoke, develop and nurture personal excellence as a way of life. This program provides the following opportunities to the learners:

- 1.3.1. To recognise their inherent potential and to develop self-confidence to successfully deal with the challenges of life.
- 1.3.2. To enhance their personal and interpersonal effectiveness.
- 1.3.3. To gain deeper insight of nature's limited resources and to become self-sufficient and self-reliant.
- 1.3.4. To imbibe values in action and become role models, teachers and administrators of tomorrow.
- 1.3.5. To develop a pleasing personality that inspires and encourages collaborative actions for a common, inclusive and self-sustaining society.

1.4. Ability Enhancement Elective (AEE)

These courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc. These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed for this purpose. These courses may be discipline based or of generic nature. There shall be SIX AEE courses for an undergraduate program one for each semester.

1.5. Co-Curricular Activities (CCA):

Under these activities, the students will be exposed to the following courses:

CCA 1: Adhyatmic Sangeet

CCA 2: Stotra Parayanam

CCA 3: General Knowledge

CCA 4: Indian Culture and Spiritual Studies

CCA 5: Yogasanas

These courses will run through all the semesters of the UG programme.

1.6. Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA)

Under these activities, the students will be exposed to activities such as Games, Sports and other service activities prescribed by the University from time to time.

2. EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION

Evaluation mechanism would essentially consist of two major components, Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) and End Semester Examinations (ESE). All the processes and procedures explained in this section are to be observed with strict confidentiality.

2.1. Continuous internal evaluation:

- 2.1.1. The internal evaluation marks shall be based on two tests or two assignments or one test and one assignment for Theory papers (DSC or DSE), and at least one test for AEC and AEE courses. The average marks of the two tests or two assignments or one test and one assignment shall be taken as the internal assessment marks. The teacher is at a liberty to conduct these evaluations by having a uniform test for all the students or having different tests for different groups of students at different times by dividing the students into number of groups.
- 2.1.2. The Internal assessment marks shall be communicated to the Registrar (Evaluation) at least 15 days before the commencement of the University End Semester Examinations and the Registrar (Evaluation) shall have access to the records of such periodical assessments.
- 2.1.3. There shall be no minimum in respect of internal assessment marks.
- 2.1.4. A candidate, who has failed the result, shall retain the internal assessment marks. In order to pass the result, he has to appear for supplementary examination which contributes to semester end marks.

2.1.5. Practical course:

- In case of practical examination in Mathematics, CIE component of 20 marks consist of 10 marks for the record and 10 marks for student participation in practical sessions all through the semester.
- In case of Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology, CIE component of 20 marks consist of 10 marks for the record, 5 marks for the observation book and 5 marks for student participation in practical sessions all through the semester.
- 2.1.6. For Co-curricular activities, viz., Adhyatmic Sangeet, Stotra Parayanam, General Knowledge, ICSS & Yogasanas evaluation of the candidate is done after completion of the course through internal evaluation only either through oral, written or practical examinations or a combination of any of these depending on type of the activity. However, there shall be no end semester examination for these subjects.

2.1.7. For extracurricular activities viz., Games & sports and Service Activities the concerned in-charge shall award a grade to the candidate and no marks will be associated with the evaluation.

2.2. End Semester Examinations (ESE)

- 2.2.1. There shall be Theory and/or Practical examinations at the end of each semester, ordinarily during October/November for odd semesters and during April/May for even semesters.
- 2.2.2. Setting of Theory Question Papers:
 - The question paper pattern shall be decided by the respective Board of Studies in the case of DSC and DSE papers.
 - The question papers shall be set by examiners, either internal or external or combination of both as decided by the Registrar (Evaluation) in consultation with the Deans of the Faculty, depending on the nature of the course.
 - Two sets of Questions papers shall be obtained for DSC and DSE courses.
 For AEC and AEE courses, one question paper will be obtained.
 - The question papers shall be put in appropriate format by Registrar (Evaluation) section.
 - In the case of DSC and DSE courses, the Registrar (Evaluation) would select one of the two question papers as the final paper an hour before the examination.
- 2.2.3. *Evaluation of Answer Scripts*: Following steps shall be followed with regard to evaluation of ESE papers: -
 - After the examinations, the answer scripts/booklets are collected and jumbled.
 - A unique random code is assigned to each script.
 - The mapping of the code to student registered number is dissociated from the answer scripts and saved separately.

- The scripts without the details pertaining to student's identification are forwarded to the evaluators for correction.
- Evaluator for a course is selected by the Registar (Evaluation) in consultation with the respective Dean.
- The evaluator can be internal or external, to be decided by the Registrar (Evaluation), based on the course and programme of study, and in consultation with the respective Deans.
- The corrected scripts along with the marks are to be returned to the Evaluation Section of the University within a stipulated time; two weeks in the normal course of events.
- The corrected scripts are decoded and ordered before the marks are recorded.
- The answer scripts along with the question paper are preserved safely.
- 2.2.4. Practical examinations shall be conducted at the end of each semester. The statement of marks sheet and the answer books of practical examinations shall be sent to the Registrar (Evaluation) immediately after the practical examinations.
- 2.2.5. The candidate shall submit the record book for practical examination duly certified by the course teacher and the H.O.D/staff in-charge of that Semester. It shall be evaluated at the end of each Semester during the practical examination.
- 2.2.6. *Practical course*: 30 marks pertaining to practical semester end examination consist of 25 marks for the practical performance and 5 marks for viva voce.

Undergraduate Admissions

Eligibility Criteria:

- The Entry Qualification shall be in accordance with the directions of UGC (Specification of Degrees, July 2014)
- Further, the candidate must possess in their PUC, or 11th and 12th class exams of equivalent boards:
 - o a minimum of 50% marks in English
 - o at least 55% aggregate marks in the main subject disciplines
- The above criterion would be subject to modification by the Academic Council.

Admission process: The following procedure will be followed for the admission.

- 1. <u>Entrance Test</u>: A written test for the eligible candidates will be conducted by the University for admission into Bachelor's degree.
- 2. <u>Interview</u>: Candidates who obtain score above a cut-off, to be decided by the University every year, will be shortlisted for a personal interview for the final selection.
- 3. <u>Final Selection</u>: The final selection is done based on candidate's overall standing on academic, extra–curricular aspects as well as attitude and aptitude towards valuebased education system.

Admission of NRI and overseas students:

The NRI or overseas candidate would have to obtain Equivalence Certificate from Association of Indian Universities (AIU) for the School Level 10+2 Examinations of their respective Foreign Boards.

The rest of the eligibility criteria for all the UG Programmes of Study would remain the same as mentioned above.

1. Background

- a) Sri Sathya Sai University for Human Excellence is a Private University, established in the district of Kalaburagi, Karnataka, by Sri Sathya Sai University for Human Excellence Act, 2018, an Act of Karnataka State Legislature (Karnataka Act No.17 of 2018 dated 21st April 2018). The Establishment of Sri Sathya Sai University for Human Excellence is sponsored by Prashanthi Balamandira Trust, a charitable trust with exemption under section 12A of the Income tax Act, 1961 and approval under section 80G of the Income Tax Act, 1961.
- b) The Government of Karnataka vide Notification no. 'ED 253 URC 2018' dated 8th March, 2019 sanctioned permission to Sri Sathya Sai University for Human Excellence, to commence it's Academic and Research Activities.
- c) The University is situated at Navanihala village, Kamalapura Taluk, Kalaburagi District, Karnataka.
- d) The income of the University is exempt under section 10(23C)(iiiad) of the Income Tax Act, 1961 read with Rule 2BC of the Income Tax Rules, 1962, as the gross receipts of the University is below Rupees one crore.
- e) The University has applied for Income Tax exemption under section 10(23C) of the Income Tax Act, 1961 on 3rd February, 2020.

2. Basis of Accounting

- a) The accounts have been drawn under historical cost convention in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles and on accrual basis.
- b) No previous year comparitives have been provided since the year 2019-20 is the first year of operation.
- c) Depreciation is provided at the rates as prescribed under the Income Tax Act, 1961 and the rules made thereunder.



The Chancellor informed the board that the Sponsoring Body Prashanthi Balamandira Trust has handed over the property records to the University as per the Government norms.

Agenda 6: First Batch Admissions

The Chancellor observed that there is a need to support a group of PU Students who passed out in the year June 2018 with values-based integral education and had been waiting for the Sri Sathya Sai University for Human Excellence to receive Government order to commence the classes. The students waiting were those who predominantly belonged to poor background and were keen to educate themselves in the values-based education system of Sri Sathya Sai Educational Institutions. Hence placed before the board a proposal to conduct admission process and commence the classes at the earliest for the first Batch of Students.

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Dr. Hanumanth Rao Naidu suggested interview-based selection with basic eligibility qualification in terms of marks secured in II PUC or equivalent, for the PUC students of June 2018 to hasten the process of admission. However, he noted that an entrance test followed by an interview for admissions in subsequent batches would be more appropriate.

Action 6: It was resolved to admit the students on first come first serve basis and interview for June 2018 PU pass out batch and commence the classes for this batch from 1st April 2019 itself. Also, it was decided to shorten the semester duration, if needed, for this batch by having additional classes or crash courses.

Agenda 7: Teaching and Non-Teaching Appointments

Considering the commencement of first batch from April 1st 2019, Honorable Chancellor suggested the need to work on faculty appointments. It was proposed that the selection of the required faculty can be done from the pool of candidates available with the Central Human Resource (CHR) department of the sponsoring body. In this regard, till permanent appointments happens contract appointments can be considered.

Action 7: It was resolved to authorize the Board of Management under the chairmanship of Prof Srinivasu, Special Officer, to make required teaching and non-teaching appointments, permanent or contract.

Agenda 8: University Finance and Accounts

Action 8: The board authorized the Finance Committee to establish necessary finance and accounts operations to fulfill statutory and regulatory requirements. However, until the Finance and accounts section at the University is stabilized, the sponsoring body will support the concerned operations.

Agenda 9: Draft Statutes

Action 9: The Board authorized Prof Srinivasu and Dr. Hanumanth Naidu to draft the first Statutes of the Sri Sathya Sai University for Human Excellence.

Agenda 10: Sri Sathya Sai Philosophy of Education

The Hon. Chancellor elaborated on the unique philosophy of Education of Sri Sathya Sai Baba, based on his association of several decades with various Sathya Sai Educational Institutions, wherein focus is developing students into integrated personality. However, he noted that this University is unique as it aims to take its pupil to the ultimate inner perfection taking human to divine. He also noted the importance of ancient Gurukula System of education wherein students learnt from teachers who lived with them in an Ashram setup. Also, education was provided with no cost. Drawing motivation from these the following was resolved:

Action 10: No Fee policy - The board resolved that the University would charge no fee whatsoever to its pupil. Further, it will provide for free hostel boarding, lodging, and clothing to the students irrespective of any discrimination whatsoever.

Action 11: Residential System of Education - The board resolved that it would be mandatory for all students of the University to stay in the hostels, until and unless permitted otherwise by the Board of Management based on special requirements.

The Conference is being organized as a major sustainability event to bring together thought leaders, practitioners, teachers, educators, policy makers as well as youth from around the globe to share innovative ideas, case studies, practices and policies and come forward with recommendations for incorporating environmental sustainability as a core concept in the school education system.

Respected Pro-Chancellor Dr. A. R. Manjunath chaired the meeting. He welcomed all present to the First Academic Council meeting of the Sri Sathya Sai University for Human Excellence.

Agenda 1: Government Order

Pro-Chancellor briefed all about the Government Order received on 8th March 2019 according to which the University has mandate to commence the admissions and classes.

Action 1: The council noted the Government Notification No. ED 253 URC 2018, dated 8th March 2019, permitting Sri Sathya Sai University for Human Excellence to commence its activities.

Agenda 2: First and Second Batch of Student Admissions

Dr. Manjunath noted that there is a group of students who had passed out from their Pre-University College (PUC) in June 2018 and had approached the Chairman of the sponsoring body Prashanthi Balamandira Trust and also the Chancellor of the University, Sri B. N. Narasimha Murthy requesting admissions into SSSUHE. Considering that the University Act had come into existence in March 2018, these students have been waiting for admissions in SSSUHE to open. Most of these students are from poor background and cannot afford higher education elsewhere. Thus, the BOG has directed to commence the admission process and classes as early

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as possible to save the time lost for these students since June 2018. Also, conduct of their classes need to be planned in such a way so as to be able to recover their lost time as much as possible.

Dr Hanumanth Rao Naidu noted that as per resolution of the BOG meeting held on 11th March 2019, the process of admission for the students who passed out PU in June 2018 will consist of interview alone.

Next, admission policy as prepared by team headed by Prof Srinivasu was discussed. It was resolved that for batches the admission process would consist of an Entrance test followed by an interview.

Action 2: As per the direction of the Board of Governors, it was resolved to admit the students on first come first serve basis and interview for June 2018 PU pass out batch and commence the classes for this batch from 1st April 2019 itself. Also, it was decided that for this batch, if needed, additional classes or reduction in holiday duration can be considered to recover the lost time.

Action 3: Admission policy was accepted and it was resolved to be implemented from second batch admission onwards.

Action 4: Further, it was resolved to initiate the process of admission for the second batch of students to enable commencement of their classes from June 2019.

Agenda 3: CBCS Based Curriculum

Prof. P. D. N. Srinivasu highlighted the need for following Curriculum of Choice Based Credit System as provided by the UGC for greater learning opportunity to students based on their choices.

Action 5: The council resolved to follow CBCS based curriculum stipulated by UGC for the Undergraduate programs of BA and BSc.

Agenda 4: Syllabus for BA and BSc program

Respected Pro-Chancellor Dr Manjunath updated the council about the ad hoc committee made in connection with the syllabus preparation for BA (HEP), BSc (MPC) and BSc (BZC) program for which the University has the mandate to start the classes as per the Government order. Prof P D N Srinivasu, who headed this committee, noted that the committee has made recommendations based on the latest model curriculum structure provided by the UGC for undergraduate programs, and the syllabus is predominantly the model syllabus recommended by the UGC.

Action 6: The draft syllabus for the BA (HEP), BSc (MPC) and BSc (BZC) programs prepared as per the UGC model syllabi for the first batch was accepted subject to future scrutiny and recommendations by the Board of Studies.

Agenda 5: Co-curricular activities

Respected Pro-Chancellor conveyed the message of the Chancellor regarding Co-curricular activities playing significant role in the integrated personality development as per the vision and philosophy of the Sri Sathya Sai Education System.

Prof. Srinivasu presented before all the draft list of curricular and co-curricular activities planned to be part of the Undergraduate studies.

It was brought to the notice of the council that a Rural development Workshop was being planned under the direction of the Chancellor, to decide the syllabus and scheme for a course in Integrated Rural Development.

Action 7: The draft document for co-curricular activities was accepted to be integrated in the Undergraduate first-degree programs.

Agenda 6: Distribution of Marks

Dr Anand proposed the distribution of internal examination and end semester examination to be in the ratio of 40:60. This would help to give sufficient importance to both the Continuous Internal Evaluations (CIE) as well as End Semester Examinations (ESE) in the Undergraduate studies.

Action 8: It was resolved to have a ratio of 40:60 marks for the distribution of marks between CIEs and ESE.

Any other subject

With no other matter to be discussed, the Pro-Chancellor Dr Manjunath thanked all for participating in the discussion thereby concluding the meeting.

Agenda 4: Commencement of Post-Graduation Programme

The Vice Chancellor submitted to the Council the proposal to commence from June 2020 Post Graduate Programmes in the disciplines of,

For MSc: Mathematics and Physics

For MA: Economics, English, Sanskrit and Kannada

The Council deliberated on the commencement of Postgraduation programme from June 2020. Considering that this would be the first batch of Post Graduate admission, it was proposed that interview-only based selection can be adopted for the admission.

Action 4: The Council approved the proposal to commence postgraduation programmes from June 2020 in the disciplines proposed in Agenda 4.

Action 5: The Council recommended interview-based selection for the first batch of postgraduate students.

Agenda 5: Review of UG Curriculum

The member secretary placed before the Council the UG Curriculum for a review by the honorable members.

The members deliberated in-depth about the Curriculum structure. Prof Lokanath suggested that the respective subject teachers should have the freedom to conduct and evaluate the internal tests.

Dr Anand Solomon drew attention of the Council towards the need to for more detailed policy for handling backlog in examinations.

Prof Venkatesulu emphasised the need for teachers to be well-prepared for classes. They must have proper teaching plan as well as good teaching notes and material before the commencement of the course. He also suggested to expose students to practical courses and programming languages such as Matlab, Octave, etc., right from the beginning of the UG programme to encourage and instill research capabilities in them.

With regard to tutorial classes Prof Savadatti suggested that such classes should be innovative and help both slow and fast learners. Prof Lokanath added that such classes should also help develop analytic ability in the students.

Prof Savadatti suggested that extra-curricular activities specified in the UG curriculum can also be associated with credits along with the grades. To this the Vice Chancellor Prof P D N Srinivasu responded that the University would develop scientific approach in assessing the extra-curricular activities before they can be incorporated into the credit scheme.

Recording of class lectures for feedback to the teacher as well as to help the student in reviewing the material was another point that was deliberated by the Council.

Action 6: The Council reviewed the existing UG Curriculum and approved the same.

Agenda 6: Review of Admission Policy

Prof Venkatesulu suggested that in University's Admission Policy, approved in the first council meeting held on 15th March 2019, the eligibility criterion for BSc and BA programmes can be changed from minimum of 55% marks in English either to 45% or 50%. This would help students from disadvantageous background with regard to English knowledge. Also, bridge courses can

be conducted for such students to improve the communication skills. To this Dr Pragya replied that the University has a unique Self Development and Communication course wherein the students are trained with regard to communication skills.

Action 7: The eligibility criterion for BSc and BA programmes was modified as: The candidate must possess in their PUC, or 11th and 12th class exams of equivalent boards:

- a minimum of 50% marks in English
- at least 55% aggregate marks in the main subject disciplines

CHAIRMAN OF THE MEETING

Sri Kumar K Heble, the Secretary to the meeting and member of the Finance Committee extended warm welcome to all the members present and requested Sri B. N. Narasimha Murthy, Chancellor of the University to preside over the meeting and conduct the proceedings.

Sri B. N. Narasimha Murthy after having ensured that the quorum is formed, called the meeting to order.

Preamble:

The Chairman elucidated the 'mission and objectives' of the University. He emphasised the importance of prudent financial management and proper upkeep of financial and accounting records as per the applicable regulatory framework. The Chairman urged the members of this Finance Committee to take responsibility to establish a strong 'internal control system' by setting up 'systems and processes' for quality reporting of the financial affairs of the University. He further emphasised the fact that the University being dependent on donations and contributions, it is extremely necessary and prudent to manage the expenditure of the University and utilize the available resources optimally.

At the request of the Chairman, the Vice Chancellor, Sri P. D. N Srinivasu, commenced the proceedings of the meeting. He gave an overview of the programmes initiated by the University and the necessary additional infrastructure, facilities and faculty members required to conduct the programmes.

The Chairman took this opportunity to thank the Government of Karnataka for initiating the process of establishing the University through an Act of the Legislature. The Chairman also placed on record his deep sense of gratitude for the support received from the Government of Karnataka for having encouraged and supported the formation of the University to provide quality education.

ITEM NO.1 - APPLICATION OF PAN AND TAN NUMBERS

The University was incorporated by Sri Sathya Sai University for Human Excellence Act, 2018, an Act passed by the Karnataka Legislature (Karnataka Act No. 17 of 2018 dated 21st April, 2018). The

University established by an enactment of the Karnataka Legislature being unitary in nature, is a separate legal entity. The Finance Officer brought to the notice of the Committee the need to obtain the PAN and TAN numbers to establish its legal identity with the Income Tax Department.

After due discussions, the Chairman authorized the Finance Officer to initiate the process of obtaining Permanent Account Number (PAN) and Tax Account Number (TAN) for the University by making suitable applications with the Income Tax Department.

ITEM NO.2 - UNIVERSITY FINANCE AND ACCOUNTS

The Chairman brought to the notice of this Finance Committee, the resolution passed in the Board of Governors meeting of the University held on March 11, 2019, that the University shall impart quality education to it students, completely free of cost. The operations of the University shall be based on the donations and contributions received by the University from public at large.

The Chairman also brought to the notice of the Finance Committee the nature and extent of the financial and other support provided by Prashanthi Balamandira Trust, the sponsoring body and profusely thanked them for the same.

Sri R. K. Subramanya, nominee of the sponsoring body, assured the Finance Committee, that sponsoring body will continue to provide requisite funds to the University for its operations and acquisition of assets till the University attains independent financial stability.

Sri R. K. Subramanya also brought to the notice of the Finance Committee, that the University is required to submit before the Sponsoring Body, periodical budget estimates, along with the quotations, bill of quantities, etc., for release of funds to meet the necessary expenses of the University.

ITEM NO.3 - ASSETS VESTED TO THE UNIVERSITY BY THE SPONSORING BODY

The Chairman brought to the notice of the Committee that M/s Prashanthi Balamandira Trust, the Sponsoring Body, acquired, created, arranged and built certain assets and has vested the same to the University in accordance with Section 4(5) of the Sri Sathya Sai University for Human Excellence Act, 2018 by a resolution passed by the Sponsoring Body dated April 1, 2019.

The assets vested to the University included Land and Buildings, Plant and Equipment, Furniture and Fixtures etc. aggregating to Rs.19,01,76,767/-. After due discussions, the Chairman requested the Financial Officer to incorporate these assets into the financial records of the University by passing appropriate entries in the Books of Accounts.

ITEM NO.4 - MONTHLY BUDGET ESTIMATES OF REVENUE EXPENDITURE

Finance Officer and Secretary to this meeting, Sri Kumar K Heble, placed before the meeting details of operational expenses incurred since inception of the University to the date of this meeting aggregating to Rs.10,69,487/- and capital expenditure amounting to Rs.1,19,014/-. The Finance Committee discussed the details of the expenditures and approved the same.

The Finance Officer, based on the present level of activities, placed before the committee, a monthly expenditure budget estimate amounting to about Rs.10 Lakhs per month consisting of operational expenses as well as administrative expenses.

The committee took note of the monthly expenditure budget estimates and after due deliberations approved the same. The Chairman directed the Finance Officer to present fresh monthly budget estimates before the committee during the next Finance Committee meeting.

Sri. A. R. Manjunath further suggested the committee to prepare estimates for refurbishing of the Auditorium cum prayer hall and University building. He also suggested about establishing a separate kitchen and dining facility for guests.

Sri. Hanumanth Rao Naidu proposed for acquisition of a generator for the University as there are intermittent disruption in power supply. The Committee considered the above suggestions made by the Pro-Chancellor and Registrar (Administration) I/C. The committee directed Sri. Kumar K Heble to prepare capital budget estimates along with the quotes, bill of quantities for the same and submit a request before the Sponsoring body along with the revenue budget estimates.

ITEM NO.5 - OPENING OF BANK ACCOUNT

Sri. Kumar K Heble brought to the notice of the Finance Committee the need to open a current account with Canara Bank, Kamalapur branch to receive funds from the Sponsoring Body as well as donations and contributions from donors.

After due discussion, the Committee unanimously resolved to open a bank account with Canara Bank, Kamalapur branch in the name of Sri Sathya Sai University for Human Excellence (SSSUHE). The Committee further resolved that the bank account with Canara Bank, shall be operated jointly by any two signatories among the three signatories set out below:

CHAIRMAN OF THE MEETING

The Finance Officer welcomed Sri B. N. Narasimha Murthy, the Chairman of the Finance Committee and the members of the Finance Committee. He requested the Chairman to preside over the meeting and conduct the proceedings. Sri B. N. Narasimha Murthy, Chairman of the Finance Committee presided over the meeting.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Leave of absence granted to Sri. R. K. Subramanya, Nominee of the Sponsoring body. Rest of the Committee members being present, the meeting was called to Order.

ITEM NO.1 - Minutes of the previous Meeting

The minutes of the previous meeting of the Finance Committee held on 27 May, 2019 were read by the Finance Officer and the members confirmed and approved the same.

ITEM NO.2 - Bank Account of the University

The Finance Officer placed before the Committee a copy of the Bank Statement and informed the Committee about the opening of a Current Account with M/s Canara Bank as envisaged in the previous meeting. The Finance Officer explained to the Committee that a Current Account has been opened with Canara Bank, Kamalapur Branch, bearing Account No.0459201000261.

The Committee took notice of the same. The opening of the Bank Account has facilitated the University to receive fund transfers from the Sponsoring Body as well as donations and contributions from public at large.

Dr P. D. N. Srinivasu, the Vice Chancellor of the University, requested the Finance Officer to ensure and collect KYC information of the donors as and when donations are received and issue necessary receipts to such donors.

ITEM NO.3 - APPLICATION FOR EXEMPTION UNDER SECTION 10(23C) OF THE INCOME TAX ACT, 1961

Dr A. R. Manjunath, the Pro-Chancellor raised the issue of providing 80G recognition certificates to the donors. The Finance Officer, explained to the Committee the need to move an application before Director (Exemptions), Income Tax Department, to seek exemption under the provisions of Section 10(23C) of the Income Tax Act, 1961. He further explained that the application for recognition under Section 80G of the Income Tax Act, can be moved only after the exemption under Section 10(23C) is granted.

The Finance Officer explained to the Committee that the necessary application under Section 10(23C) can be moved only after the allotment of PAN number. He further explained that steps have been initiated to move the application for allotment of PAN and TAN numbers, and that he would brief the status of these applications in the next Finance Committee meeting.

After detailed discussion, the Finance Officer, was authorised to initiate the process of moving an application before the Director (Exemptions), Income Tax Department to seek and obtain the necessary exemption as soon as the PAN number is allotted.

ITEM NO.4 - REVIEW OF THE FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS OF THE UNIVERSITY

Sri Kumar K Heble, Finance Officer placed before the Committee, the revenue and expenditure of the University up to the date of meeting to review the current financial position of the University.

The Chairman further remarked that the work related to the construction of additional sports facilities for students like football ground, basketball ground, levelling of cricket stadium, pavilion refurbishment etc., needs to be taken up.

With regard to the ongoing work of refurbishment of Auditorium cum prayer hall, Dr A. R. Manjunath suggested for improvement the audio and video equipment. The Committee members also deliberated on the ways of improving digital infrastructure of the campus including the Auditorium cum prayer hall equipment.

The Chairman further directed the Finance Officer to prepare capital expenditure estimates and approach the Sponsoring Body to raise necessary funds.
